What does it do?

Finney's Invisible Oil is a unique, ultra matt finish that leaves light coloured timbers looking like they haven't been treated; yet gives resistance to general wear and finger marking.

What is it used for?

Finney's Invisible Oil is used to protect pale woods such as doors, furniture, worktops and stair parts. It can also be used on floors with low foot traffic.

How do you use it?

STIR WELL. The best application method is to apply thin coats using a **Trade Synthetic Brush**, working **Finney's Invisible Oil** well into the wood. Always work along the grain. Denib (lightly rub down) between coats using **400 grit Wet 'N' Dry** abrasive paper (used dry), wiping off any fine dust created with a **Tack Cloth**.

How long does it take to dry?

Finney's Invisible Oil takes around 1 hour to dry. Full cure 5 days.

Staining

Use Finney's Professional Water Stains to colour wood.

To achieve the <u>dry</u> colour of the stain, add around 15% of <u>Finney's Invisible Oil</u> or <u>Finney's Trade</u>
Acrylic Varnish into the stain to act as a binding agent before use.

How much do I need?

2-3 coats are generally required although a single coat can be used where the aim is simply to keep out dust. Coverage is approximately 10sq m per litre per coat for most woods.
